#### Sixth Form Open Evening

We had a very successful and busy Sixth Form Open Evening yesterday. It provided a great opportunity for Year 11 students, and their parents, to visit the school and talk to staff along with Year 12 & Year 13 students about life in the Sixth Form. I hope it was a positive and informative experience for all. A school based Sixth Form provides really effective pastoral care and support, something we believe is particularly distinctive at Imberhorne. I am very grateful to the Sixth Form students who spoke at the event, it can be a little nerve-racking to speak in front of such large audiences. It is a tribute to Quinlan and Megan, our students, for speaking with such assurance.

#### Year 11 Mock Exams

There are two more weeks of school before our Year 11 students commence their mock exams. These are very important assessments, the results of which will play an important part in deciding which post-16 pathways they may follow. In our Sixth Form, as with schools and colleges elsewhere, there are certain entry requirements students must meet to be accepted onto courses. Historically we recognise that unless students can work at a certain level in Year 11 they are unlikely to cope with the demands of certain courses in the Sixth Form. Whilst we expect exams to go ahead in the summer for Year 11 and Year 13, it is also understood that mock exam performance, along with other assessment information, may help inform final grades for some students (particularly if they are unable to sit final exams). Mock exam grades are a good indicator of likely final grades in the summer. We expect all Year 11 students to be revising at least an hour a night and at least two hours a day at the weekend. Once mock exams commence, from Monday 6<sup>th</sup> December, Year 11 students will be on exam study leave, only attending to sit exams. At other times they should be revising.

### Reading Day & Sixth Form Taster Lessons

On Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> November students in Year 12 and Year 13 have a reading day and are not expected in school. Most Year 11 students will participate in Sixth Form taster lessons, experiencing what a day in the Sixth Form feels like. They are not expected to wear uniform on that day but will need to have their lanyard and ID card on them. A smaller number of Year 11 students, intending to go elsewhere next year, will participate in a team building day of activities. They have been informed about this separately.

# Year 8 Virtual Consultation Evening – Compressed Day

On Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> December we are holding our Year 8 virtual Consultation Evening. This is a compressed day with lessons finishing at 2.30pm, allowing time for our technical team to set up cameras and headphones for staff prior to commencing appointments.

### Imber200

At a recent Governors' finance committee meeting we discussed various ways parents support the school. One long established scheme is called Imber200.
