Cashless Catering / ParentPay

Our canteen operates a cashless system – students have a cashless catering account that parents add funds to online via a system called ParentPay. Any purchases made in the canteen are then taken from the funds that have been loaded onto the account. Students in receipt of Free School Meals will receive an allowance added to their account each day.

Students are issued an ID Card on the first day of term in September - this card gives them access to their cashless catering account and should be presented when they reach the canteen till.

All food is available on a turn-up and buy basis, however we also offer the option of pre-ordering lunchtime hot meals via the Fusion Online app to offer the certainty that your preferred meal is available.

We will e-mail ParentPay and Fusion Online login details to you during the last week of the Summer holidays so that you can add credit to your child's cashless catering account. If you haven't received log-in details by Monday 1st September please contact our IT Support Team at itsupport@imberhorne.co.uk or on 01342 310989.

We also use ParentPay to collect payments for other things we may seek parental contributions towards, such as school trips.

WhatsApp

We are aware when some students join in Year 7, they sometimes use WhatsApp to set up group chats for their form/friendship groups. This is actively discouraged at Imberhorne and if your child is thinking about starting or joining one of these groups, we would advise you to ensure they leave the group, and if your child is admin of one of these groups, we ask that the group is closed. This is in order to fulfil our duty to keep our students safe. Social Media does not provide the best training for young people to navigate social situations, and messages can be hurtful and unkind.

Please be advised that the minimum age of use for WhatsApp is 16. Students should also be aware that in group chats, people who are not in their contacts will be able to see all the messages and send them messages.

I have also taken the opportunity to send the activity booklet mentioned in last week's letter and handed to students on the induction day.

I will write again next week with a few final details about the start of term.
