Dear Parents and Carers

Exam season has begun at Imberhorne, with students in Year 11 Food completing their Non-Exam Assessment (NEA) practicals, cooking some highly impressive dishes under exam conditions over the last week. The smells, as you can imagine, have been very enticing and the end products quite spectacular. A special thanks for the Food Tech team who have done such a great job of supporting students. We have also seen the final performances for Year 12 and 13 Performing Arts students before their exam next week. As you know, Year 11 will take their final round of mock exams next week, which we hope will provide them with the platform for confidence in the real things in May and June. This round will also see them receive final detailed feedback and guidance for revision and practice to address any gaps in a full exam experience before the real thing. Please encourage them to take on board as much as they can before designing a realistic revision timetable to take them through Easter and into next term.

Elsewhere, Bronze DofE students have this week completed their First Aid course to enable them to go on practice expeditions in the coming weeks. Over 100 Sixth Form students have also visited the Higher Education Conference at the University of Surrey. We also hosted local schools for the Maths Feast competition, entering two teams of Year 10 students and winning one round. There was no overall winner but students did a fantastic job of representing us against teams from Ifield Community College, Oathall Community College, Sackville School, St. Paul's Catholic College, St. Catherine's School and Riddlesdown College.

We look forward to seeing parents and carers face-to-face next week, Thursday 13th March for our trial Year 8 Consultation Evening at Windmill Lane. In our previous parent/carer survey there was still a majority who favoured the online setup, but we will take further feedback from attendees at next week's event to see what your thoughts are. A reminder that school will close at 2.30pm on this day to allow for a prompt start to this event.
